

Atlantic Aviation Building New Facilities at BNA

Atlantic Aviation is investing \$40 million in new facilities at its BNA campus. According to the BNA General Manager, Aaron Wood, the expansion brings their total BNA lease properties to 24.5 acres.

The new Nashville themed FBO terminal will feature 12,000 square feet of space which will include a VIP area for special groups. The facility will be LEED as part of Atlantic Aviation's green initiatives. The new FBO will showcase technology with high end amenities for passengers and

crews. A substantial increase in parking will help accommodate customers at peak travel times.

Atlantic Aviation is also building a 30,000 square feet hangar facility where the TDOT administration building once resided. The hangar will offer 3,000 feet of office space split between 5 offices and a lobby area. Work is underway to expand Atlantic's fuel farm capacity with the installation of a new fuel farm. Work on the facilities is scheduled to be completed by 4th quarter of this year.

Industry News

SMS

The FAA has proposed the expansion of mandatory SMS compliance to certain Part 21 Type Certificates, air tours operated under FAR Part 91.147 and all operations conducted under FAR 135. They have also proposed additional requirements in Part 5 (the FAA's SMS rule). The FAA is seeking comments on their proposal that individual Part 135 operators might be better suited to identify the appropriate fatigue mitigations for their operations through an SMS rather than a more prescriptive regulatory approach. 5G

A proposed FAA airworthiness directive on methods to mitigate interference to aircraft systems from 5G telecommunications networks "falls short of the goal of preserving safe operation of airplanes in the National Airspace System (NAS)," stated a coalition of aviation groups.

NBAA joined with the Aerospace Industries Association (AIA) and 19 other industry groups, avionics manufacturers and aircraft OEMs in commenting on the FAA's notice of proposed rulemaking (NPRM) addressing interference from 5G networks operating within and adjacent to the 4200-4400 MHz frequency range, also known as the C-Band, also used by radar altimeters.

As currently written, the proposed AD could also carry significant operational ramifications to business aviation operators. "While we recognize and appreciate the FAA's work with industry stakeholders on mitigations to 5G interference, the proposed AD does not account for the full impact from this situation to all users," said Heidi Williams, NBAA senior director for air traffic services and infrastructure.
